

FluMist® helps prevent the flu in eligible* children 2 years to 18 years of age

▷ FluMist is given as a gentle nasal mist—a quick spray in each nostril¹

▷ FluMist showed efficacy vs. the flu shot¹⁻³

—Children who got FluMist had fewer cases of flu than those who got the flu shot in a large study that included children 2 years to 5 years of age during the 2004-2005 flu season

NOTE: Since flu strains change from year to year, past study results do not guarantee future flu season results.

▷ FluMist is expected to be available during the back-to-school period, so your child can get vaccinated during a well-child visit or sports physical

▷ FluMist does not contain thimerosal or other preservatives¹

▷ FluMist may cause side effects. Most common side effects included runny nose or nasal congestion, sore throat, and fever¹

The Centers for Disease Control (CDC) guidelines now recommend including all school-aged children through the age of 18 years for an annual flu vaccination^{4}*

*Please note: Children less than 24 months of age are not eligible to receive FluMist. Children with asthma, and children less than 5 years of age with recurrent wheezing should not get FluMist.
