**Announcing Faith Lutheran's Middle School Servant Event
Students Volunteer at Multiple Las Vegas Charities**

Each year, students at Faith Lutheran Jr/Sr High School truly embrace what's at the heart of their Christian teachings by helping those in need. Now in its third year, Middle School Servant Day teaches kids what service means to them, and to their community.

On December 21, 2007, more than 500 students, grades six through eight, will donate their time and energy helping such organizations as US Vets Home, Opportunity Village and Boys and Girls Club. Their activities vary, from sorting clothes and food pantries to helping students from low-income schools, to aiding veterans and senior citizens with chores.

"It's one thing to hear about Christian values," says Kevin Dunning, executive director of Faith Lutheran Jr/Sr High School. "It's another to put these words to action. Our students love the Middle School Servant event, because it allows them to see a side of Las Vegas with which they have little contact."

Students volunteer in groups of 20 and each group is facilitated by a Faith Lutheran teacher who works in an advisory capacity. When selecting a site to volunteer, the advisory teachers and students collaborate, basing their decision on the need of nonprofit, appropriate work for middle school students, and whether the work fits in with the Christian values of the school.

Faith Lutheran Jr/Sr High School is the largest non-public school in Nevada. Its mission is to provide a quality and balanced education in a Christ-centered environment.
